NAVIGATIONAL RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP 2014

Supplementary Regulations

1 The Scottish Association of Car Clubs will promote a Championship to be known as the “Scottish Navigational Rally Championship 2014”. The MSA Championship Registration Number is TBC.

2 The Championship will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association Ltd (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any other written instructions issued by the Championship organisers.

3 Entry

(i) The Championship is open to members of any club affiliated to the Scottish Association of Car Clubs. In the event of a club ceasing to be a member of the Association, competitors may only count points gained from events entered under that club up to the date of that club ceasing its membership.

(ii) Entry into the Championship is by any of the following two methods.

(a) Competitors can complete and return an entry form to the Championship Administrator at any point in the duration of the Championship via post, e-mail or in person.

(b) Competitors can enter the National B Navigational section of any Championship event. Entry to Clubman, 12-Car or Historic sections of events does not count. While entry is automatic to the Championship, competitors can withdraw by e-mailing or writing to the Championship Administrator. This must be done within 14 days of the first event in which they compete.

(iii) There is no limit to the number of competitors.

(iv) Registration opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes when signing-on closes at the final championship event of 2014.

4 Classes

(i) The Championship will consist of six classes, with separate classes for drivers and navigators at three levels of experience.

(ii) The eligibility requirements at each level will be defined as follows:

EXPERT	Open to any competitor.
NON-EXPERT	Limited to competitors who have, in any one calendar year from 2009 to 2013, scored no more than four class wins as a navigator at Non-Expert or higher level on navigational events of Clubman or higher status. Note: the restriction on navigating experience also applies to competitors intending to drive at Non-Expert level.
NOVICE	Limited to competitors who have, whilst navigating, been classified as a finisher in no more than 6 navigational events of Clubman or higher status between 1 st January 2012 and 31 st December 2013 <u>or</u> been classified as a finisher in no more than 4 navigational events in any one calendar year since 1 st January 2008. Note: the restriction on navigating experience also applies to competitors intending to drive at Novice level.

For the purpose of the above definitions, a navigational event includes any Road Rally, Historic Road Rally, Targa Rally or Navigational Rally.

- (iii) Entry into the Championship under SR.6.ii.b is subject to competitors being eligible to register for the class. This does not prevent competitors from entering any individual event, subject to the event entry eligibility requirements, but will prevent competitors from scoring points in the Championship.
- (iv) Competitors are expected to inform the Championship Administrator if they are not eligible to register for a class in the Championship under which they enter a Championship event. If the Championship Administrator has information available to them that a competitor is not eligible to be registered they may not include the competitor in the list of registered competitors.
- (v) Competitors may register for more than one class provided they are eligible for each class they register for.

5 Points

- (i) Points will be awarded to each competitor who starts each event based on their final position relative to all other registered championship competitors in the same class. Competitors may only score points in one class on any single event.
- (ii) The following scale of points will be used

Finish position in class	Points awarded
1 st	12
2 nd	10
3 rd	9
4 th	8
5 th	7

Excluded	0

- (iii) A competitor will be awarded the following points for helping to organise or run a Championship event

Position	Points awarded
Clerk of the Course, Event Secretary	12
Other Officials named in event SRs	10
Other signed-on Officials. e.g. marshals	9

- (a) Organisers points will be only be awarded once. The highest points value attained during the year will be the value used. In the event of event cancellation, the organisers points will not be awarded.
- (b) Points for Clerk of the Course, Secretary of the Meeting and other Officials named in event SRs will be awarded automatically and will be taken from event Supplementary Regulations.
- (c) Points for being a Signed-on Official must be claimed from the Championship Administrator within 7 days of the Championship event they wish to claim points for.
- (d) Points will be awarded to the class for which the official is registered as a competitor. If an official is registered for more than one class they must inform the Championship Administrator within 7 days of the event which class they wish the points to awarded for, failing this the points will be awarded to class for which the official last scored points as a competitor. If an official has not registered for the Championship, the points will be awarded retrospectively to the class for which they first register.

6 Protests & Championship Officials

- (i) All eligibility challenges, disputes, irregularities or appeals should be addressed to the Championship Administrator who will liaise with the Championship Stewards.

Appendix A – Event Guidelines

This section is primarily for organisers but will enable competitors to know the standard of event to expect.

- A1. Events should endeavour to issue draft regulations to the Championship Administrator 8 weeks prior to the event, and final versions to competitors 6 weeks before the event.
- A2. Events should be greater than 60 miles long – there is no maximum length for the Championship but less than 150 miles is suggested.
- A3. Events should include the following in their Entry Form:





and organiser should advise the championship Administrator accordingly.

- A4. Events should use the classes defined in the championship regulations.
 - (i) All clue types at Novice level should be selected from the list of types attached to the regulations (Appendix B) or if not on the list, agreed in advance by a Championship Administrator and the type of clue notified to the competitors before the start of the event.
 - (ii) Non-Expert level clues should be one degree of difficulty above Novice level. Expert clues are recommended to be one level harder than Non-Expert. In both cases it is not required that the clues stem from the same type as the Novice clue for the section.
 - (iii) Novice competitors should be given the location of all the controls, Non-Expert competitors should be given the location of two-thirds of the controls and Expert competitors should be given the location of one-third of the controls.
- A5. All clues and timecards must be checked by at least one competent other person than the compiler a minimum of 10 days before the event to allow time for any corrections to also be checked. The championship Administrator will hold a list of potential clue checkers.
- A6. Events should issue results to competitors within 1 hour of the last competitor arriving at the finish venue. Where this is not possible, the results should be distributed to all competitors within 7 days.
- A7. Any awards must be presented on the night of the event unless it is not possible to issue any results.
- A8. Events should, whenever possible, display clues and their solutions for all classes, together with the correct route at the finish.
- A9. Events must return details of entries and results to the Championship Administrator within 7 days of the event. These details must include the club that competitors entered under and should state if any competitor does not want to be included in the championship.

Appendix B – Novice level clue types

This section lists the clue types to be expected at Novice level. In some cases other clue types may be used after agreement with the Championship Administrator and providing details of the clue type are circulated to competitors before the event. This list is expected to alter through time – a copy of the current list will be maintained on the SACC website on the Navigational Rally Championship pages.
