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ARTICLE 1 ANNOUNCEMENT

1.1 Stonehaven & District Motor Club Ltd (SDMC) will organise a dual permit National B and Clubmans Navigational Rally on Saturday 28th October 2017, starting at Cullerlie Farm Park, Echt MR 38/746028

1.2 The National B Navigational Rally will be a qualifying round of the following championships:-

- (a) The Scottish Association of Car Clubs Navigational Rally Championship
- (b) The Stonehaven & District Motor Club Championship
- (c) NESMG Championship

1.3 The Clubman Navigational Rally will be a qualifying round of the SDMC Championship only.

ARTICLE 2 JURISDICTION

2.1 The event will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association Ltd (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the Organisers may issue for the event. All references shown *in italics* contained within these Supplementary Regulations refer to the appropriate section of the 2017 Competitors' and Officials' Yearbook.

ARTICLE 3 AUTHORISATION

ARTICLE 4 ELIGIBILITY

4.1 The National B event is open to members of all clubs which are affiliated to the following associations:-

- (a) Scottish Association of Car Clubs
- (b) Association of North East & Cumbria Car Clubs
- (c) Association of Northern Car Clubs

4.2 The Clubman event is open to members of the following invited clubs:-

4.3 All competitors must produce a valid club membership card at signing on. Competitors in the National B event must also produce a valid MSA Competition Licence (Non-Race National B or higher). Competition Licences (Non-Race National B) can be applied for at signing on. Application forms for these licences should be downloaded from the MSA website, or are available from the Entry Secretary prior to the closing date for entries and must be fully completed and accompanied by the appropriate fee and photograph.

ARTICLE 5 PROGRAMME

5.1 The timetable for the event is as follows:-

ARTICLE 6 SCRUTINEERING AND SIGNING ON

6.1 Scrutineering will be held on Saturday 28 October 2017 at Cullerlie Farm Park, Echt MR 38/746028, commencing at 17:30 hrs and ending at 18:45 hrs..

6.2 Signing-on will take place on Saturday 28 October 2017 at Cullerlie Farm Park, Echt MR 38/746028 commencing at 17:30 hrs and ending at 19:00hrs. Any competitor not signed on by this time may be excluded.

6.3 All vehicles must comply with the relevant MSA Technical Regulations for navigational rallies [(J)5] and must be taxed, have a valid MOT certificate and be insured for use on the public highway. Please note that J5.16.7 requires petrol engined cars, manufactured after 31/12/99 to be fitted with a catalytic converter. Commercial vehicles are not permitted [(R)5.1 and (J)5.20.6] except for car derived vans of less than 2 tonnes gross laden weight.

6.4 Vehicles must be presented in a clean condition [(H)33.1.2] and in the same condition as they intend to compete.

6.5 Every competing vehicle will be subject to a noise test. The maximum permitted noise level is 86db(A) at two-thirds maximum rpm at 2.0 metres. [(J)Chart 5.18 'D']

6.6 Additional checking may be carried out at any time during the event, of competitors as well as of the vehicles. The Entrant is responsible for the technical conformity of his vehicle throughout the entire duration of the event. Vehicle servicing during the event is not permitted with the exception of efforts by competitors to maintain compliance with **Articles 6.3 and 6.5**

ARTICLE 7 ROUTE INSTRUCTIONS AND TIMECARDS

7.1 The route will be contained on OS Landranger Maps, Sheet 38 Aberdeen.Revised July 2015 (Reprinted Feb 2017) and Sheet 37 Strathdon and Alford Revised July 2012 (Reprinted Feb 2017) Any feature of the map, legend or cardboard cover may be used to define the route to be taken.

7.2 Total mileage will be approximately 100 miles, timed to the minute.

7.3 First vehicle will start at 19:31hrs. Vehicles will start at one minute intervals.

7.4 Competitors will be supplied with route instructions and timecards at the start and as necessary throughout the event. These will provide sufficient information to enable competitors to comply with (R)9.2 – (R)9.2.3. Competitors should take the shortest route complying with all instructions.

7.5 Any correction or amendment made to timecards will result in exclusion from the event, unless such a correction or amendment has been approved by a competent marshal.

7.6 It is the responsibility of competitors for submitting timecards to Marshals at the correct time at controls and for the accuracy of the entries thereon.

ARTICLE 8 IDENTIFICATION

8.1 Competitors will be identified by rally numbers, which will be supplied by the organisers and must be displayed at all times during the event in the nearside rear window of the competing vehicle.

ARTICLE 9 CLASSES

9.1 The National B event will consist of 3 classes:

- **EXPERT** – Open to any competitor.
- **NON-EXPERT** – Limited to competitors who have, in any one calendar year from 2011 to 2016, scored no more than four class wins as a navigator at Non-Expert/Intermediate or higher level on navigational events of National B or higher status. Note: the restriction on navigating experience also applies to competitors intending to drive at Non-Expert level.
- **NOVICE** – Limited to competitors who have, whilst navigating, been classified as a finisher in no more than 6 navigational events of Clubman or higher status between 1st January 2015 and 31st December 2016 or been classified as a finisher in no more than 4 navigational events in any one calendar year since 1st January 2011 Note: the restriction on navigating experience also applies to competitors intending to drive at Novice level.

9.2 The Clubmans event will consist of 3 classes the same as the National B event, and competitors will be seeded to run after the National B competitors in each class.

ARTICLE 10 AWARDS

10.1 The Hairst Shield will be presented to the 1st Expert Driver and Navigator of the event. The Kennedy Shield will be presented to the highest placed SDMC crew. These trophies will be presented at the SDMC Dinner Dance. These trophies remain the property of SDMC and must be returned to an office bearer of SDMC upon request or by 31st October 2018

10.2 Individual awards will be presented to the first driver and navigator in each class at the event, provided 4 or more start in a Class..

ARTICLE 11 ENTRIES

11.1 The entry list opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes finally at 17:00hrs on Monday, 23rd October 2017. The entry fee for the National B and clubman events is £35.00 (post event cuisine and refreshments are included). All entries must be made on the official entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. **Competitors should note that an entry is not valid (D12.1.4), and cannot be accepted, until the specified entry fee is received**

11.2 The maximum number of entries is 60, the minimum is 12. The Organisers reserve the right to cancel the event should the minimum number of entries not be reached by the closing date.

11.3 Entry fees will only be refunded if written notice is received by the Entries Secretary on or before the closing date. Refunds after that date will be at the discretion of the organisers. Should the event be cancelled, entry fees will be refunded in full. Organisers reserve the right to refuse entries.

11.5 Confirmation of receipt of entries will be dispatched by e-mail as soon as possible. Acceptance of entries will be at the discretion of the Organisers, and entries may be refused without any reason being given.

11.6 Competitors will be seeded within their class and will start in numerical order. Class running order will be Expert, Non-expert, Novice . Seeding will be done at the organisers' discretion.

ARTICLE 13 PENALTIES, RESULTS AND PROTESTS

13.1 Competitors will start with zero marks. Classification for the order of merit will be by reference to total marks by class, the winner being the competitor with the least total penalties.

13.2 In the event of a tie, the competitor who has completed the greater portion of the route without penalty will be the winner, failing which, a timed navigational test will be used.

13.3 Marking and Penalties will be as per the "Time" Penalties system in the General Regulations of the MSA **(R)13** except for the following:-

13.4 Competitors can make up time as per **(R)12.6.1**

13.5 Route checks will take the form of code boards (example displayed at the start) and manned passage checks. **[(R)11.3 - (R)11.4.2]**.

13.6 The event will be run to schedule timing [(R)12.2].

13.7 Provisional results will be declared in accordance with General Regulation (D)26.1.2. These results will become final when the protest time has expired, or all outstanding protests and appeals have been settled. A copy of the full results will be posted on the SDMC website and sent to all competitors within seven days of the finish of the event by e-mail.

13.8 Protests must be made in accordance with General Regulations (C)5.1 – (C)5.7 and Appeals in accordance with General Regulations (C)6.1 – (C)6.6.

ARTICLE 14 FINAL INSTRUCTIONS

14.1 Final Instructions will be issued by e-mail to all competitors, copies will be available at signing on.

ARTICLE 15 MODIFICATIONS TO THE GENERAL REGULATIONS

15.1 All other General Regulations of the MSA apply as written except for the following which are modified:

- (a) Only the competitor named on the entry form as the driver may drive during the event [(R)5.4.3].
- (b) Competitors may carry mobile telephones in their vehicle for emergency use only [(R)7.2.3].
- (c) Global Positioning Systems may be used [(R)18.6.4].

ARTICLE 16 INSURANCE

16.1 Competitors must produce, at Signing-On, their own Insurance Documents, showing that they have extended their own Private Motor Insurance, or sign and pay for cover under the Rally Guard Road Section Insurance Scheme. Failure to do so will result in the refusal of a start.

16.2 The Organisers have applied to Jelf Insurance Partnership for a Blanket Cover Note under the above scheme. This will provide competitors who need to use the scheme with the Third Party Cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the event.

The basic rate for the event before any loadings will be **£13.25** All applicants wishing to use the scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Jelf Insurance Partnership's Declaration: -

- a) I do not have the Third Party Road Section extension on my current Motor Insurance.
- b) I am aged 20 or over.
- c) I have had no more than 1 fault claim in the last three years
- d) I have no more than maximum of 6 conviction points on my UK driving licence
- e) I have the appropriate competition/club membership licence as well as a UK/EU driving license and if my license is provisional I will be supervised by an adult over 25.
- f) I have no physical or mental disabilities
- g) I have no other material facts to disclose
- h) Anyone aged less than 20 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25.

If you comply with all points above no Letter of Acceptance will be required. If unable to comply with any of the above points you will be required to complete the Declaration form (the form can be obtained by contacting the event secretary or Jelf Insurance Partnership) which should be forwarded either to the organisers or direct to Jelf Insurance Partnership prior to the event to allow sufficient time for a letter of acceptance to be issued.

ARTICLE 17 DAMAGE DECLARATION

- 17.1** Competitors at the conclusion of their Competition must sign a declaration to the effect that they have not been involved in any incident that may have caused damage to persons or property, or alternatively give details of any such incident. Non-compliance will be penalised in accordance with **(R)15.1.2 Chart13(q)** and may be reported to the MSA for further disciplinary action.
- 17.2** Competitors who retire from the event will be required to submit a form to the Secretary of the Meeting within 72 hours of the event. Failure to return a form may result in a fine of up to £190. **[(C)2.4]**

ARTICLE 18 DRIVING STANDARDS/OBSERVERS / JUDGES OF FACT

- 18.1** Judges of Fact appointed by the Organisers will be on duty throughout the rally to observe and report excessive noise; driving behaviour, Stop & Give Way protocol and the use of main beam and auxiliary Lights in Quiet Zones. The names of these Officials will be notified in an Official Bulletin which will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 18.2** The Scrutineer appointed for the event is the Judge of Fact in respect of Vehicle Eligibility.
- 18.3** Any cases reported to the MSA by the Police for speeding, reckless driving or failing to observe road signs will automatically be considered as a possible contravention of General Regulation **(C)1.1.4** (Any proceeding and/or act prejudicial to the interest of the Motor Sports Council or of motor sport generally) and the competitor concerned will be liable to be called before a Disciplinary Tribunal. It will not be necessary to prove that a traffic offence was committed, as the involvement of the Police may, itself, give rise to contravention of General Regulation **(C)1.1.4**.
- 18.4** Judges of Fact will report all incidents to the Clerk of the Course who will apply the appropriate penalty. The Clerk of the Course will have the sole responsibility for exclusion.

ARTICLE 19 GENERAL

- 19.1** There is no fuel available near the start/finish venue. Fuel is available 24hrs in Aberdeen, Portlethen and Elgin. There are a number of filling stations that are open until 2300hrs and a few open until 2400hrs.
- 19.2** Timing will be by official timepieces. All clocks will be set to the BT time signal.
- 19.3** All official times and mileages will be deemed to be correct.
