



Supplementary Regulations Stonehaven & district motor club



Clubcross **Coneyhatch Farm, Stonehaven** **5th May 2013**

1. The Stonehaven & District Motor Club Ltd will promote a Clubman status Clubcross on **Sunday 5th May 2013** at **Coneyhatch Farm, Stonehaven.**
2. The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association, (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may use for the event.
3. MSA Permit no is **77099.**
4. The event is open to all fully elected members of the organising club and the following invited clubs;
Aberdeen & District Motor Club
63 Car club (Elgin)
750 Motor Club (Scotland)
Highland Car club
Grampian Automobile Club
Glenrothes Motor Sport Club
5. All entrants drivers must produce a valid Club Membership Card and Competition Licence (Clubman or higher grade) at signing on. G3.1.3 a properly completed and signed licence application form (including a passport photograph) together with the appropriate fee can be accepted instead of a Competition Licence.
6. The event is a round of the SDMC Club Championship.
7. The program of the event will be:-

Paddock opens at 09:00

Scrutineering and signing on starts at 09:30

Any competitor not signed on and completed walking the course by 11:00 may be excluded

First timed run starts 11:00

8. The length of the Clubcross course is 1600 metres approx, which consists of 2 laps of an 800 metre track.
9. The event will consist of six classes as follows (classes will be amalgamated if there are less than 3 cars in the class): -
Class A Economy "Standard" Production Saloons up to 1400cc (N4.20.1)
Class B Economy "Standard" Production Saloons 1401 to 2000cc (N4.20.1)
Class C Road Saloon Cars up to 2000cc (N4.20.2)

All vehicles MUST comply with the MSA Technical Regulations.

Cars in Class C must be taxed, insured and MOTed. Documents will be inspected at signing on.

All cars must compete on "Highway Pattern" tyres as per N4.20.5

Winter, M+S, Gravel, Rally or any other "knobby" tyre is NOT permitted.

Competitors are reminded of regulation N4.3 (mudflaps) and N3.5 (overalls, crash helmets and gloves)

10. Awards will be presented as follows:
1st overall (FTD) A perpetual award
1st in class A perpetual award

The awards will be presented at the annual dinner in November.

11. The entry list opens on receipt of these regulations and closes on Thursday 2nd May. The entry fee is £40.00. Late entries may be accepted and may be subject to a late fee of five pounds.

12. **Entrants who need to apply for Club Membership and / or an MSA Licence must hand in completed forms at signing on. These forms should be downloaded from the MSA (msauk.org) or SDMC (sdmc.co.uk) website and FULLY COMPLETED (inc photo as required) prior to signing on. Contact event secretary if you need assistance.**

All entries must be made on the official entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee.

e-mail or phone "intention to enter" will be accepted in lieu of an official entry but all paperwork must be completed prior to submission at signing on.

13. The maximum entry for the meeting is 40 and the minimum is 4. The maximum for each class is 20 and the minimum is 4. Should any of the above minimum figures be reached the organisers have the right to amalgamate classes or cancel the meeting. Entry will be selected by receipt. Entry fees may be refunded if cancelled 24 hours prior to the meeting.

15. Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after each run, or following the end of the event.

16. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with C5.1

17. Starting order will be in class order. Timing will be by stopwatch. The starting signal will be a green light. The finish line will be indicated by a chequered flag.
Practice is not allowed for Clubcross but competitors must walk the course prior to the first competition run.

18. Competitors will be identified by competition numbers of MSA specified size and type on **both** sides of the vehicle. Numbers will be available for sale at signing on.

19. Marking and penalties will be as printed in the appropriate section of the MSA General regulations, except the following which is modified:-

N3.8 Clubcross competitors will have a minimum of four timed runs of two laps each, an aggregate of the two fastest times will count for results.

20. All other General Regulations of the MSA apply as written. Except as modified below:-

N4.9 Classes are as stated in 9 above.

21. Anyone practising or travelling at excessive speed out with the specified course, will be automatically excluded.

Access to the venue is by permission of the landowner, please obey the speed limit signs and be considerate to other users of the farm buildings. We depend on this venue, please do not give the landowner any reason to withdraw his permission.
